FOUNDATION ENROLMENTS 2019

We are now taking enrolments for students starting Foundation in 2019. So if you have a child who was born between May 2013 and 30 April 2014 then they are eligible for enrolment in 2019.

This is for current siblings or other families in the area who wish to enroll their child. You can pick up an enrolment form from the office. We'd really appreciate you doing this as soon as you can, it makes the planning for 2019 so much easier.

ASSESSMENT AND REPORTING

Mid-year is our key assessment and reporting period. Parents may be in contact with teachers (and teachers with parents) throughout the year, yet the mid-year report provides the opportunity to view progress and set goals for the remainder of the year.

Mid-year reports will be available via COMPASS by 3.30pm on Friday the 29th June. Portfolios will be sent home with students on Friday also. Please look over these two important pieces of reporting as together they provide a clear picture of your child's learning.

Next term Three-way Conferences (teacher/parent/student interviews) will take place on Tuesday 24 July from 3.45 until 5.45pm, and on Thursday 26 July from 3.45 until 7.30pm. **Families will be able to register for Three-way Conferences from 6pm on Monday July 16.** The time set aside for conferences with classroom teachers is 15 minutes and if you would like to meet with specialist teachers, 5 minutes has been set aside for these conferences.

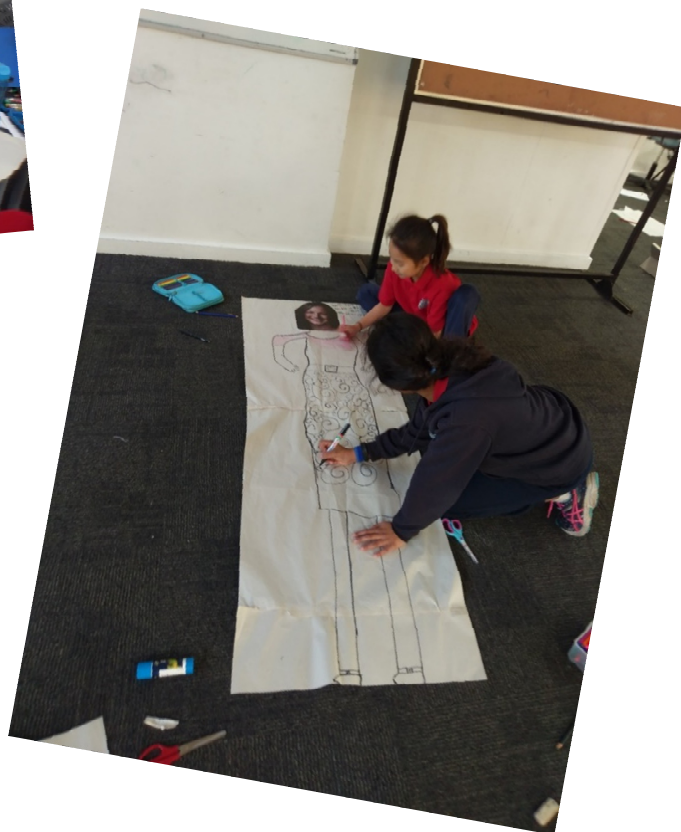
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FROM AROUND THE CLASSROOMS

JSC students have a new experience and learn new skills.

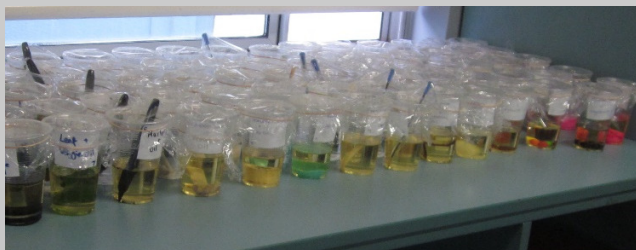
We will have a new team on board next Semester to continue on the good work.



Level 6 Inquiry Term 2

In year 6, we've been exploring science and reactions. After a range of different learning activities, including a Hands on Science incursion, each class designed their own area to investigate. We then thought about the type of experiments that could be used to delve into those areas. 6A are looking at how different household items react within commonly found liquids – some are dissolving, while others are preserving! In 6N, they're exploring the pH levels of soils found across the school with startling results right across the spectrum! 6J are growing bacteria, sourced from all sorts of items and areas of the school that are accessed daily, with all manner of microorganisms growing every day!

It's been an amazing scientific journey that will inform us all and help us to make certain changes across the school!

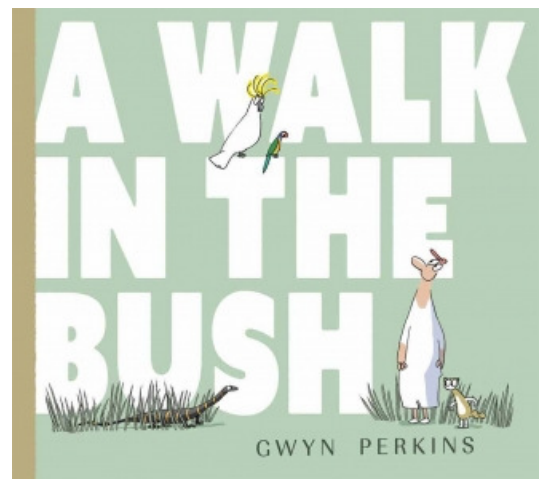
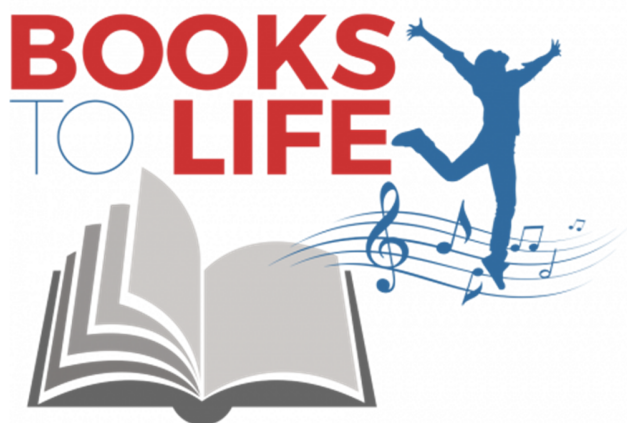
When you help us collect pencils it helps teach children about issues in the wider world.
