




Thunderstorm asthma

Summary

- People who have asthma or hay fever can get severe asthma symptoms during pollen season when high grass pollen counts combine with a certain type of thunderstorm.
- . When a large number of people develop asthma symptoms over a short period of time, this is known as epidemic thunderstorm asthma.
- · Epidemic thunderstorm asthma events are uncommon and don't occur every year. In south-east Australia they can happen during grass pollen season from October through December.
- . Thunderstorm asthma can affect those with asthma or hay fever especially people who experience wheezing or coughing with their hay fever. That's why it's important for people with asthma or hay fever to know about thunderstorm asthma and what they can do to help protect themselves during grass pollen season.

CRPS old uniform recycling drive

Each year tonnes of clothes and textiles end up in landfills, but as much as 95% could be used again. 6BM have decided to run a clothing donation drive for all the old Camelot Rise School uniforms what will not be worn again in 2018 when new uniform changes take effect.





With some research, we have discovered that the clothing company H&M has a garment collecting initiative, which has been created to decrease clothing waste.




6BM along with the Uniform Shop are running clothing drive where you can donate your old school uniforms and any other unwanted clothes. They will then be taken to a H&M store to be donated for recycling.

You will be able to donate your old school uniforms along with any other unwanted clothes and they will be taken to an H&M store to be donated for recycling.

Once the old garments have been dropped off in a store, the company I:CO collects and sorts them into three categories:

- Rewear clothing that can be worn again will be sold as second hand clothes.
- Reuse old clothes and textiles will be turned into other products, such as cleaning cloths.
- Recycle everything else is turned into textile fibres, and used for things like insulation.



We will be running this drive from Week 8 of Term 3 until Week 8 of Term 4. Marked boxes for collections will be located in the Library, Uniform Shop, Unit B, Unit D, 6BM & 4Hs classroom.

Every donation made will receive a raffle ticked to win a 15% off voucher to H&M. There will be a number of vouchers to be won. This will be drawn at the end of Term 4.



Ask for your Child Care Rebate to be paid 'directly' to OSHClub on your behalf as a fee reduction.




