remember that any medications sent to school needs to be sent to the office with a completed medication form (available from the school website or the school office) and in the original packaging. Office staff will then administer this medication at the required time. **Medications will not be administered unless accompanied by the medical form.**

DOGS ON SCHOOL GROUNDS POLICY

BACKGROUND

Camelot Rise Primary School is part of a community where the benefits of pet ownership are valued. We acknowledge the important role that pets, dogs in particular, play in our community, the positive impact that dogs can have on family life and the many responsibilities that dog ownership brings.

The school's primary duty of care is to our students, staff and the school community, through the provision of an environment that allows all individual members to remain safe, and to feel safe, whilst on school grounds and whilst travelling to and from school. This policy outlines the responsibilities of dog owners and/or handlers in relation to the school grounds, and in relation to travel to and from school when accompanied by a dog. This policy covers all dogs, with the exception of guide dogs or support dogs.

PURPOSE

- To ensure that the safety of students, staff and community members is the school's most important priority
- To take into consideration the needs and expectations of school community members and also minimise the risk of accident or injury to people or animals both within and immediately beyond the school boundary fence
- To make dog owners aware of the risks involved in bringing a dog into an environment where there are many students, pre-schoolers and adults, some of whom are unfamiliar and/or afraid of dogs
- To advise dog owners to keep their dogs at home if there is any risk of their dog becoming aggressive towards humans or other dogs whilst in the areas immediately beyond the school boundary fence

IMPLEMENTATION

- Dogs are not permitted to be on school grounds at any time
- Dog owners who bring their dog to the school when picking up or dropping off family members, must ensure that their dog is on a leash and must remain at least 5 metres from any exit / entrance gate or school crossing
- Dog owners must be familiar with their legal responsibilities and be aware that the school takes no responsibility for the behaviour or actions of their dogs
- DET Staff can request that dog owners remove their dog from the school grounds
- Incidents that are witnessed involving dogs biting or causing injuries to children, adults or other animals will be reported to the City of Monash
- The contents of this policy will be communicated via the school website, the school newsletter, COMPASS and signage placed at each school entrance gate
- Any visitor that enters the school premises, accompanied by a guide, support or service dog must first attend the General Office and sign in, as per the school's visitor policy and articulated processes



Child Care Rebate(CCR)

Most families are eligible for the 50% rebate of all out of pocket expenses for attending OSHClub programs. Many families are getting half their fees back as an immediate discount when they ask for their rebate to be applied to their account. Please note the CCR is not means tested.

Ask for your Child Care Rebate to be paid 'directly' to OSHClub on your behalf as a fee reduction.
